<u>Dr. Brian Buckley</u>, Dr. Buckley is the executive director at the Environmental and Occupational Health Sciences Institute (EOHSI). He was a key figure in helping the research group reviewing and recommending COVID-19 disinfection and deactivation technologies for NJ Transit, and is now helping with the logistics of the current COVID-19 testing procedures at EOHSI. Dr. Buckley has his PhD in chemistry, heads the RU Disaster Response Initiative (RU DRI), responding to natural and manmade disasters such as hurricanes Maria and Sandy as well as lead in the drinking water in Newark.



<u>Dr. Linda Flynn</u>, Dr. Flynn serves as Dean and Professor at the Rutgers School of Nursing. She is widely recognized for her research into the effects on patient outcomes of system factors such as nurse staffing levels. Her research stands out by extending beyond hospitals and into non-acute care such as home health care and nursing homes. Within the hospital setting, she studies relationships among the practice environment, nurses' safety practices, and the frequency of medication errors.



<u>Dr. Mark Robson</u>, Mark Gregory Robson is a Board of Governors Distinguished Service Professor and Professor of Plant Biology at Rutgers University School of Environmental and Biological Sciences. Mark's research and teaching focuses on environmental risk assessment and occupational health, specifically as it related to agricultural and rural communities. Mark established the Thai NIH Fogarty Research Center in Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok and currently is part of the GEOHealthHub leadership for the Agricultural Health Center at Mahidol University in Bangkok. Mark is the Editor in Chief of the Journal of Human and Ecological Risk Assessment.
