EXPLANATION OF JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

<u>Beginner class: all grades</u> (Formally First Year. Anyone who does not want to compete can enter this class) participation rosette given to all that enter. Non-competitive, constructive class.

Junior class 4th -6th grades: Equivalent to AKC Junior Classes

Novice: for those who have not yet received **3 PLACINGS** in this class

<u>Open:</u> for those that have **3 or more 1**st - **4**th **PLACINGS** (does not need to be in 1 calendar year) in the 4-H Junior level or have shown in an AKC Novice Junior class

<u>Master Class</u> for those kids who have shown at the AKC Open level, or have won 3 Best Junior Handler awards at 4-H shows **formerly** (*4-H Advanced class*)

Intermediate class 7th to 9th grade: Equivalent to AKC Intermediate classes

Novice: for those who have not yet received 3 1st - 4th PLACINGS in this class

Open: for those that have **3 or more 1**st - **4**th **PLACINGS** <u>AND</u> for those 4-H'ers who are moving up to the Intermediate level from the 4-H Open Junior class, or have shown in an Novice Intermediate class at an AKC show

<u>Master Class</u> for those kids who have shown at the AKC Open level, or have won 3 Best Junior Handler awards at 4-H shows **formerly** (*4-H Advanced class*)

Senior class 10th -13th grade: Equivalent to AKC Senior class

Novice: for those who have not yet received 3 1st - 4th PLACINGS in this class

<u>Open:</u> for those who have had **3 or more 1**st - **4**th PLACINGS at this level or are moving up from the 4-H Intermediate Open class, or have shown at the Novice Senior level at an AKC show

<u>Master Class</u> for those kids who have shown at the AKC Open level, or have won 3 Best Junior Handler awards at 4-H shows **formerly** (*4-H Advanced class*)

Best Junior Handler classes are determined as follows:

Best Novice - Determined from The **First Place winners** from **Novice**:

Jr. Novice, Int. Novice, Sr. Novice

Best Open - Determined From The **First Place winners** from **Open**:

Jr. Open, Int. Open, Sr. Open

Best Master - Determined from The **First Place winners** from **Master**:

Jr. Master, Int. Master, Sr. Master

Best Handler - will be determined between Winners from - Best Novice, Best Open and Best Master

- 5. Long Sit (handler across ring, 3 minutes): 30 points

Graduate Novice (AKC-based score sheet)

- 1. Heel (on leash) and Figure Eight (off leash): 40 points
- 2. Drop on Recall: 40 points
- 3. Dumbbell Recall: 30 points
- 4. Recall Over High Jump: 30 points
- 5. Recall Over Broad Jump: 30 points
- 6. Stand Stay Get Your Leash: 30 points

New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct

The primary purpose of the New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct is to ensure the safety and well-being of all participants at 4-H sponsored events and activities. It applies to all participants, with participants defined as 4-H members, their parents, and volunteers.

As a participant in the 4-H program, I will:

- Accept supervision and support from county and state 4-H staff while participating in the 4-H program. This
 includes acceptance of supervision and support from appointed 4-H volunteers coordinating 4-H events and
 activities.
- Obey local, state and federal laws.

Participants who fail to adhere to the New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct are subject to a range of disciplinary actions. Such actions will be taken in compliance with the New Jersey 4-H Discipline Policy and Procedure. When appropriate, immediate corrective action will be taken at the 4-H event to ensure the safety and welfare of all participants.
