EXPLANATION OF JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

<u>Beginner class: all grades</u> (Formally First Year. Anyone who does not want to compete can enter this class) participation rosette given to all that enter. Non-competitive, constructive class.

Junior class 4th -6th grades: Equivalent to AKC Junior Classes

Novice: for those who have not yet received 3 PLACINGS in this class

Open: for those that have **3 or more 1**st - **4**th **PLACINGS** (does not need to be in 1 calendar year) in the 4-H Junior level or have shown in an AKC Novice Junior class

<u>Master Class</u> for those kids who have shown at the AKC Open level, or have won 3 Best Junior Handler awards at 4-H shows formerly (4-H Advanced class)

Intermediate class 7th to 9th grade: Equivalent to AKC Intermediate classes

Novice: for those who have not yet received 3 1st - 4th PLACINGS in this class

Open: for those that have **3 or more 1st - 4th PLACINGS** <u>AND</u> for those 4-H'ers who are moving up to the Intermediate level from the 4-H Open Junior class, or have shown in an Novice Intermediate class at an AKC show

<u>Master Class</u> for those kids who have shown at the AKC Open level, or have won 3 Best Junior Handler awards at 4-H shows formerly (4-H Advanced class)

Senior class 10th -13th grade: Equivalent to AKC Senior class

Novice: for those who have not yet received 3 1st - 4th PLACINGS in this class

Open: for those who have had **3 or more 1st - 4th PLACINGS** at this level or are moving up from the 4-H Intermediate Open class, or have shown at the Novice Senior level at an AKC show

<u>Master Class</u> for those kids who have shown at the AKC Open level, or have won 3 Best Junior Handler awards at 4-H shows formerly (4-H Advanced class)

New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct
